School Systems Provide Vaccinations for Staff

Starting Friday, February 12th, faculty and staff members of Bristol Tennessee City Schools, Kingsport City Schools, and Sullivan County Schools received their initial doses of vaccinations for the COVID-19 virus. Through the Sullivan County Regional Health Department, vaccines were administered while students studied through asynchronous online learning. Because of most vaccine distribution plans giving higher priority to essential workers and the elderly, securing a vaccination from an outside purveyor proved difficult for teachers and near-impossible for students. This a big step in the right direction, as vaccinating teachers could help to reduce COVID spread in schools. Additionally, most Coronavirus cases show younger people tend to face more mild symptoms than adults,

so vaccinating teachers first is the most effective plan. The second and final dose will be administered to staff members starting March 5th.

Snyder Speaks on Vaccines

On December 16, the first Covid-19 vaccine was administered in Tennessee. Since then, around 650,000 more vaccines have been given in Tennessee. Smaller counties have begun giving vaccines to teachers while more populated ones are still working on distributing them to residents aged 75 years or older. Tennessee High School English teacher, Andrew Snyder, has recently received his vaccine.

Last August, Andrew Snyder signed up for a blind trial for the Pfizer vaccine. Some patients received a placebo and some patients received the actual vaccination. After it was revealed he received a placebo, Snyder was able to go and get the real vaccine on January 15th.

Besides a little soreness in his arm the next day, Snyder has reported no considerable pain or side effects. "I didn't even realize the needle went in," he said.

Andrew Snyder wanted to get the vaccine to "do his part" in "de-

feating" Covid. After receiving the vaccine, his opinions have not changed at all. Snyder says, "The only way we're going to get any sense of normalcy again is if enough individuals get the vaccine." He also adds, "This vaccine is the best, and safest, weapon to use when it comes to eradicating the virus."

Viking U: Is it for U?

With the inaugural class of Viking U, an accelerated Associates degree program for THS students, entering its second semester, registration has begun for the next batch of students. This of course has many sophomores wondering if Viking U is the right fit for them.

Starting junior year, Viking U students switch to a college curriculum at either Tusculum University or Northeast State Community College in order to earn an Associates degree upon graduating high school. Classes vary as far as being taught virtually or in-person, and tuition costs are required to complete the courses. Over the two years, students still take three electives at THS in addition to their college courses.

Owen Ferguson, an 11th Grade THS student completing the Tusculum Viking U pathway says he enrolled in Viking U because he wanted to take more challenging classes. "All of my Tennessee High classes were pretty easy, so I wanted to bump up the difficulty." In discussion of the class environment and pace, Ferguson reports "there isn't a super heavy workload. It's just dependent on how fast you get (assignments) done." The curriculum is driven entirely by completing assigned work and readings before the deadline. For students who have found success in Viking U, several attributes stand out.

Guidance Counselor Rachel Fleenor coordinates the Tusculum Pioneer Pathway. She lists some qualities that best identify with successful Viking U students: "someone who's very self-motivated, has good time management skills, Not afraid to speak up and ask for help." Being individually academically driven is the key to succeeding in Viking U. Classes are fast paced and teachers can't constantly remind students about upcoming assignments. Guidance Counselor Leslie Skeens offers another perspective. "I've always thought AP classes were harder than Dual Enrollment... If I wanted to rec-

ommend a class that you're going to be prepared for college, I'd say take Advanced Placement classes." For students who do not want to switch curriculums entirely-- or those who prefer to take many non-core classes-- there are still options for difficult courses. The caveat for AP is that receiving credit for a college course is dependent on the student's score on the AP Exam, whereas taking Dual Enrollment guarantees credit for completing the course.

"It's such an individual choice." Mrs. Skeens encourages students to consider the choice thoughtfully. "If you foresee yourself getting a masters or a doctorate, (Viking U) is a great way to jump-start it." She stresses the notion that for a specific kind of person, who is set on speeding through high-school and college to save time and money, the program can be very valuable.

For the student who is self-motivated, a diligent academic, efficient, an anti-procrastinator, ready for a fast-tracked education, ...Viking U might just be the right choice. "It's still a deal... a pretty good deal."



Computers and Covid-19

Not everyone is good with computers. No one knows this more than Dr. Blair Henley, the Chief Technology Officer for Bristol Tennessee City Schools. Henley, 50, has overseen one of the most difficult times for the Technology Department. The department consists of only 10 people, all of whom answer directly to Henley. Only 5 of those are trained technicians who fix most major issues for all the students district-wide. And on top of their regular workload, the department had to deal with a global pandemic that would cause health concerns for students and staff district-wide and lead many students to choose to stay at home. These at-home learners posed a challenge to the department, as they could not come to the Help Desk of their respective school to have issues resolved. This led to the creation of the Hotline.

The Help Desk Hotline was created in March 2020, just after in-person school was cancelled for the semester. Although this was before Dr. Henley became head of the department, he says that the technology staff "are to be commended for their efforts during these difficult times." All at-home learners call one Hotline for the whole system, and although the desk only receives about 5-10 calls per day, that number can skyrocket to 30 per day when all students are at home. Incredibly, in one period of less than three weeks between August 17 and September 3, the Hotline received 3,614 calls!

The return to in-person school required the Technology Department to set new standards for how Help Desks would operate in

order to keep students and staff safe. A student does not even physically go to the Help Desk anymore. Instead, their teacher fills out an online form and either the issue is fixed remotely or the student drops off their laptop and later receives a replacement. Very few students are able to work the Help Desk this year as well, and are not able to work at any other schools. This again puts more work on the Technology Department and the Help Desks. They have faced a monumental task this year.

However, Dr. Henley is proud of his department, and they do indeed deserve praise. In the face of a global pandemic and the restrictions that come along with it, the Technology Department has adapted and continued to serve the thousands of students and staff throughout the district

It has been over a year since COVID-19 first appeared in the United States. Since then, over 26 million Americans have tested positive and over 450,000 have lost their lives to the virus (CDC). 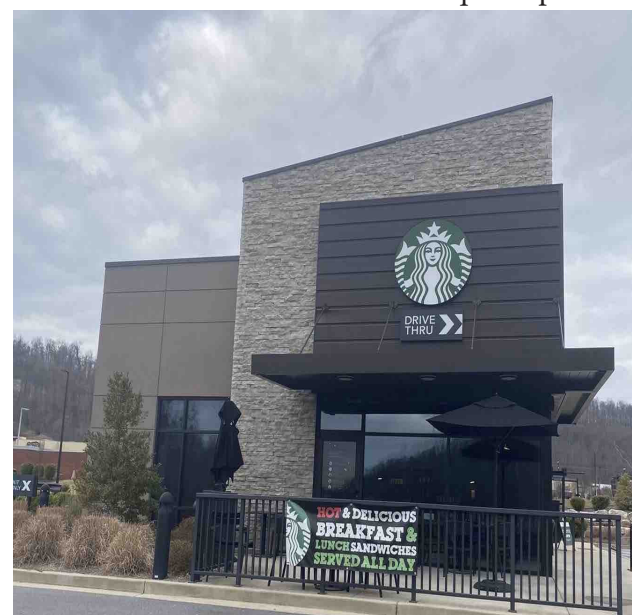

On August 10th 2020 Bristol Tennessee School Systems had their first official day of school for the 2020-2021 year. However, the dreaded "first day of school" was a little different this year. In March of 2020 Bristol Tennessee School Systems had announced the closing of all schools indefinitely, due to the covid-19 pandemic. Over the long summer many students felt like "school didn't exist anymore", according to Tennessee High freshman Joseph Burriss. 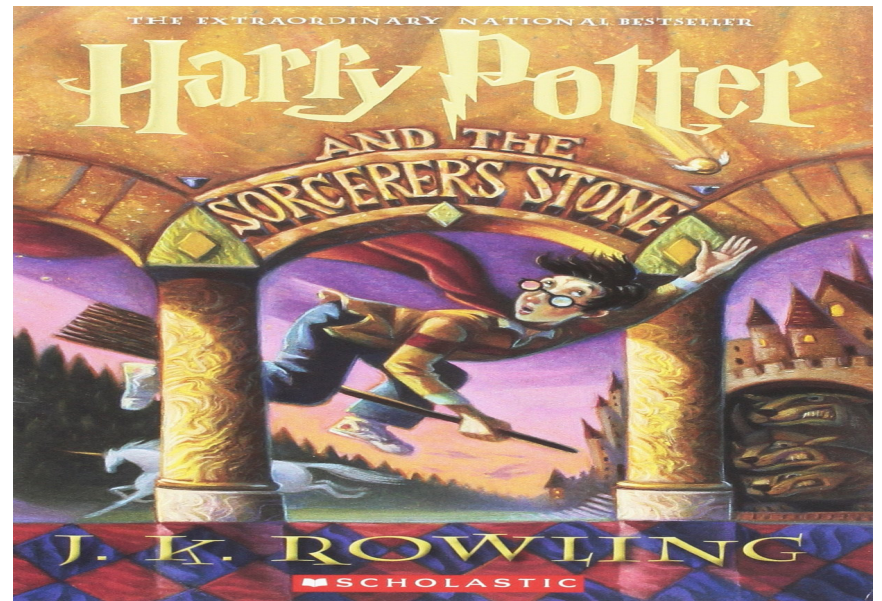

The problem arises from the fact that many werewolves in the book are written to be evil and vile creatures. This plays into the stereotype that most people that have contracted AIDS are bad, and saying there are some good apples within the bunch by the addition of Remus.

Not only does Rowling villainize people who suffer from AIDS, she writes Anti-Semitic caricatures into Harry Potter. The goblins that run the bank are characterized by their short statures, hooked noses, and their greedy and hostile personalities. These descriptions line up well with the common stereotypes of Jewish people. To add onto the obvious mimicry of the Jewish community, the background of the goblins is ridden with oppression, segregation, mistrust, and exclusion. The description of the goblins as well as their history leads directly to Anti-Semitic propaganda.

J.K. Rowling's prejudices are also prevalent in tweets she post. Numerous tweets from the author are blatantly hurtful to members of the LGBTQ community and advertise items directly hurtful toward those individuals. Many cast members of the Harry Potter movies have called out Rowling for her hurtful tweets; these complaints were met with silence from J.K. This raises the issue of separating art from the artist. Can we

still enjoy someone's piece of work, even if that someone's views are harmful to others? I say we can still appreciate the Harry Potter series. Readers just have to keep in mind that the author is not someone to be praised.

The Harry Potter series is overhyped and has many controversies within the writing and outside of it. Anti-Semitism as well as discrimination towards AIDS suffers are just some of the issues within the Harry Potter lore. Not only does the series contain prejudices, the author herself is outspoken on her own contentious views. Overall, the series as a whole is overrated. If you are looking for something similar to the Harry Potter series but without the messy history, then try the Percy Jackson series by Rick Riordan.

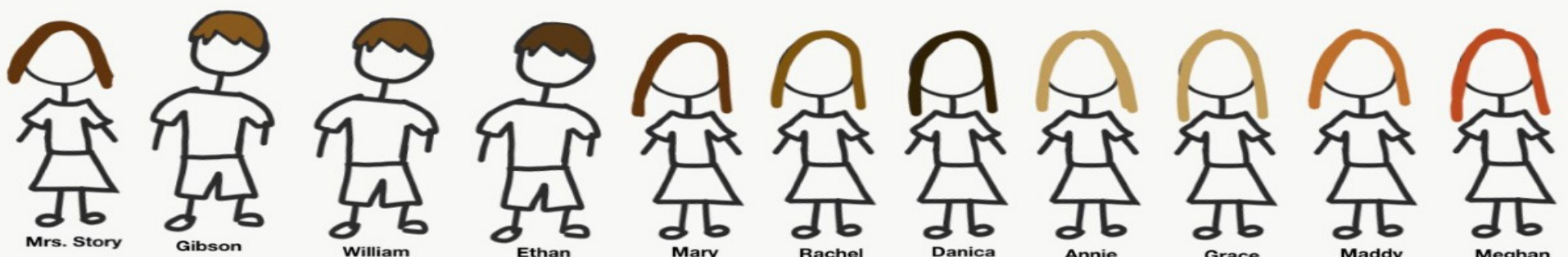

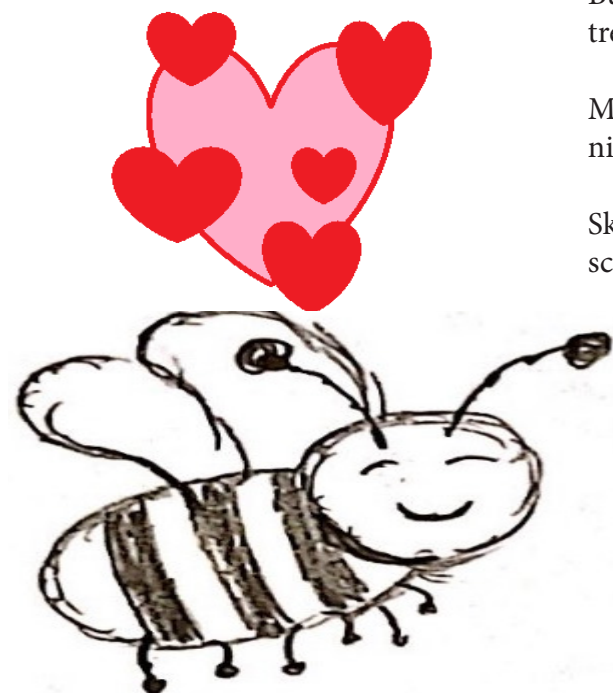

Chocolate Covered Strawberry Brownies Recipe

Ingredients List:

1/2 cup (1 stick) butter

8 ounces semi-sweet chocolate, coarsely chopped

3/4 cup granulated sugar

2 large eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/2 cup all-purpose flour

1 tablespoon baking powder

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 pound strawberries, sliced

8 ounces semi-sweet chocolate, coarsely chopped

Directions:

First, preheat your oven to 350F and grease an 8 inch baking pan

Melt the chocolate into the butter in a saucepan over medium heat

Mix the sugar into the eggs along with the vanilla

Sift the flour, baking powder, and salt together

Mix the melted chocolate into the egg mixture and then add the flour mixture

Pour the batter into the 8 inch baking pan and cook for 20-25 minutes

Sprinkle your strawberries on top of the brownies

Melt the chocolate over medium-low heat and pour it over the strawberries. Let cool until the chocolate is set (around 30-60 minutes)
