


ATHLETICS















Paced by defensive stalwarts John Keller, Danny Large, Danny Cook, Delmar Harrington, Jimmy Butcher, and Doug Williams, and offensive standouts David Booher, Marty Winchell, Buddy Royston, and Eddie Barnes; the Norsemen proved to be one of THS's finest teams. The year was overshadowed by a heartbreaking loss to Morristown which cost the Vikings sole possession of the Big Seven Conference title and was highlighted by wins over Johnson City and Virginia High.




















