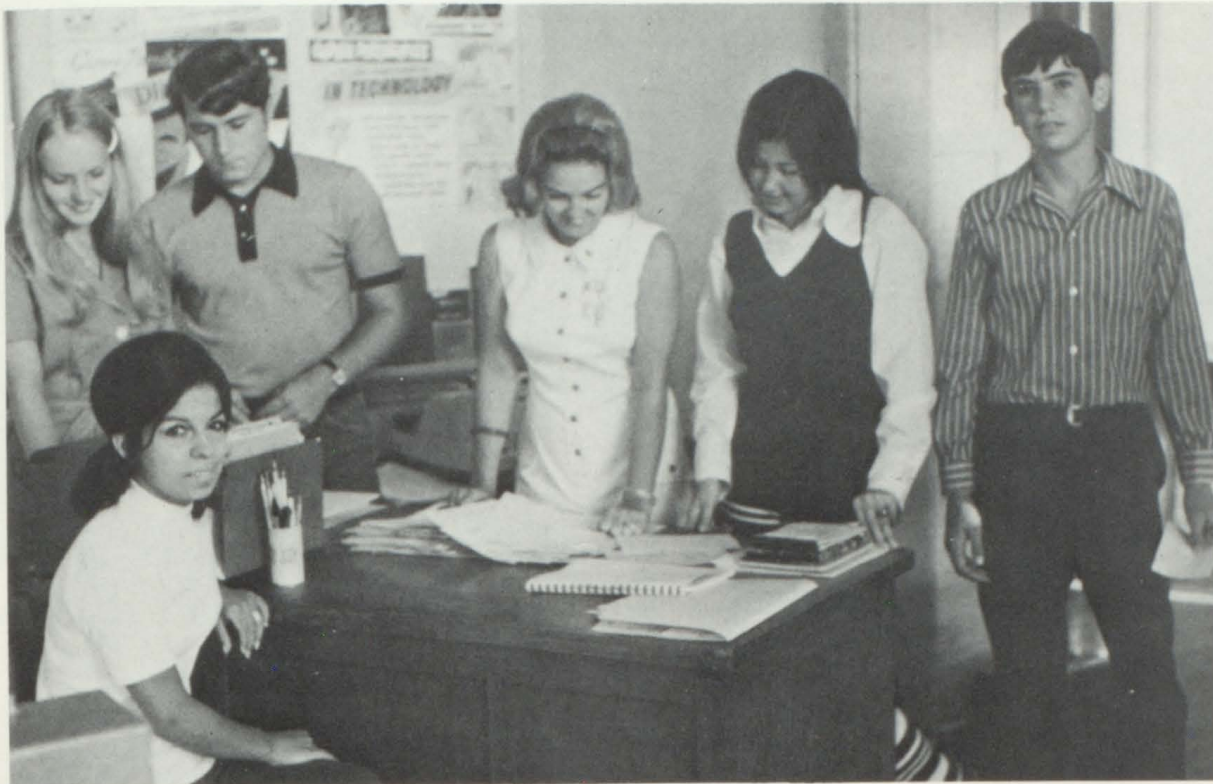

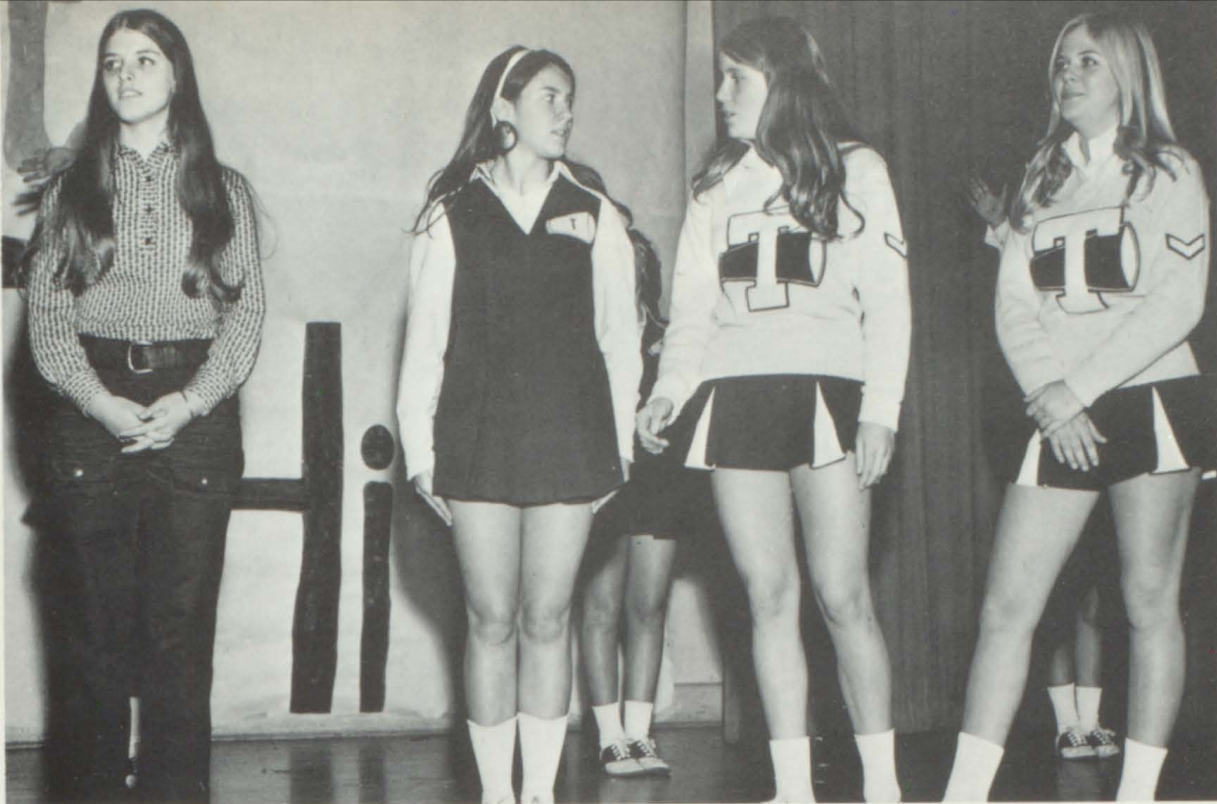

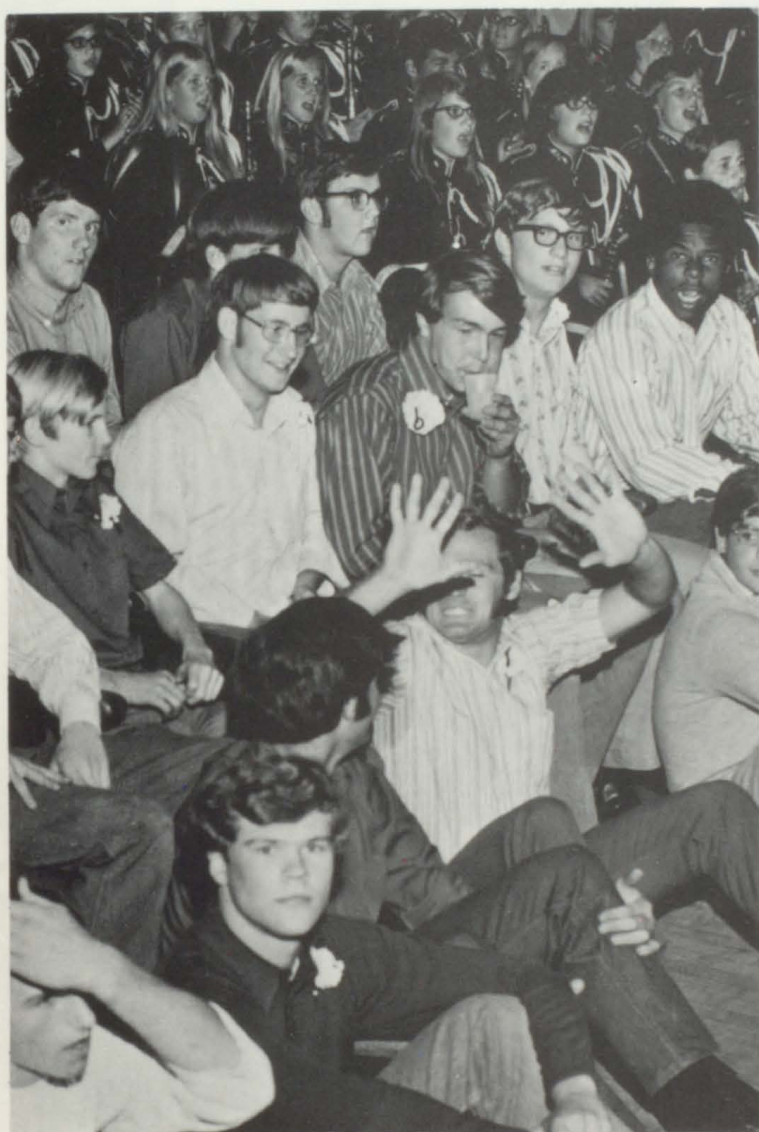

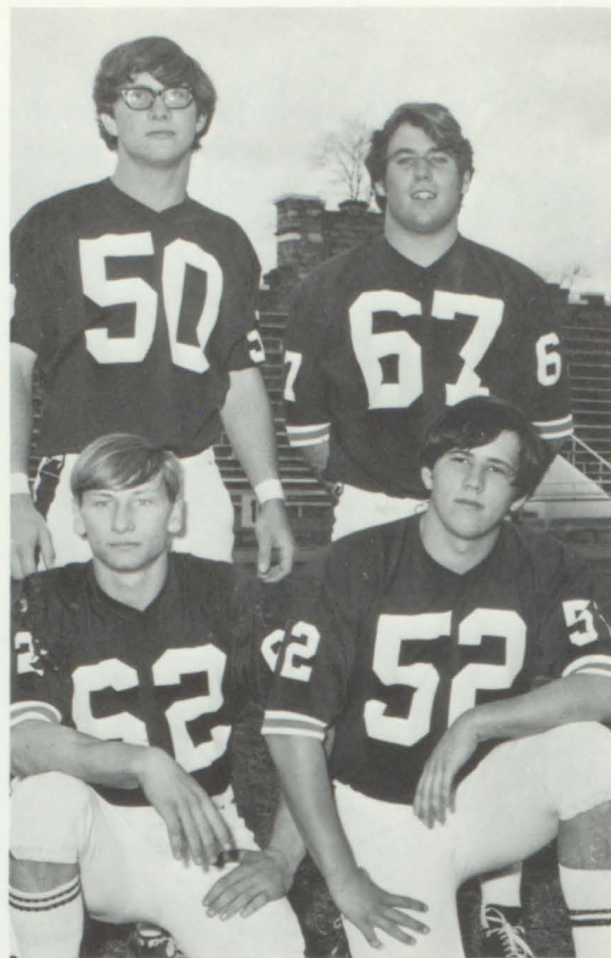

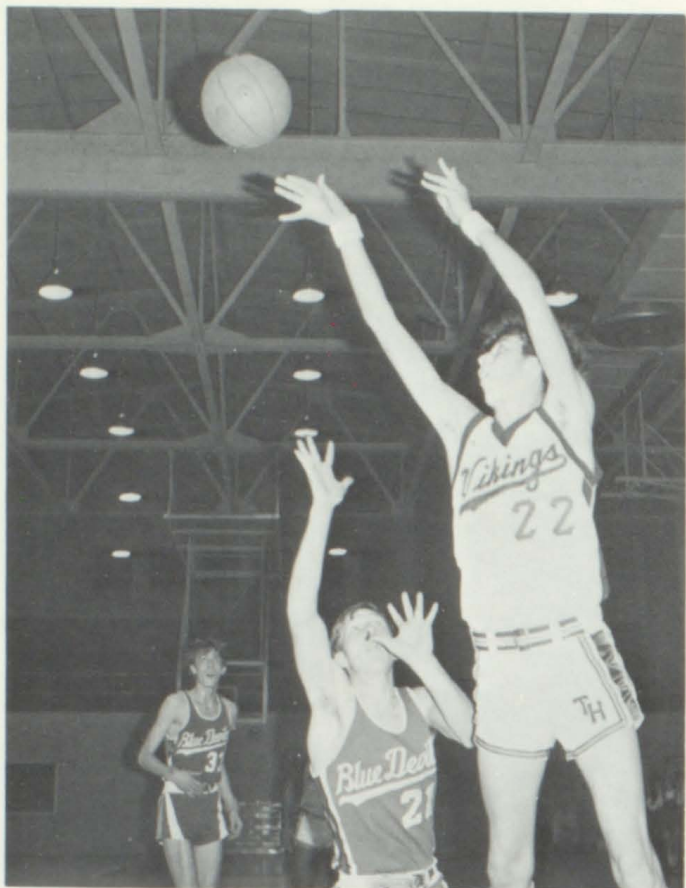

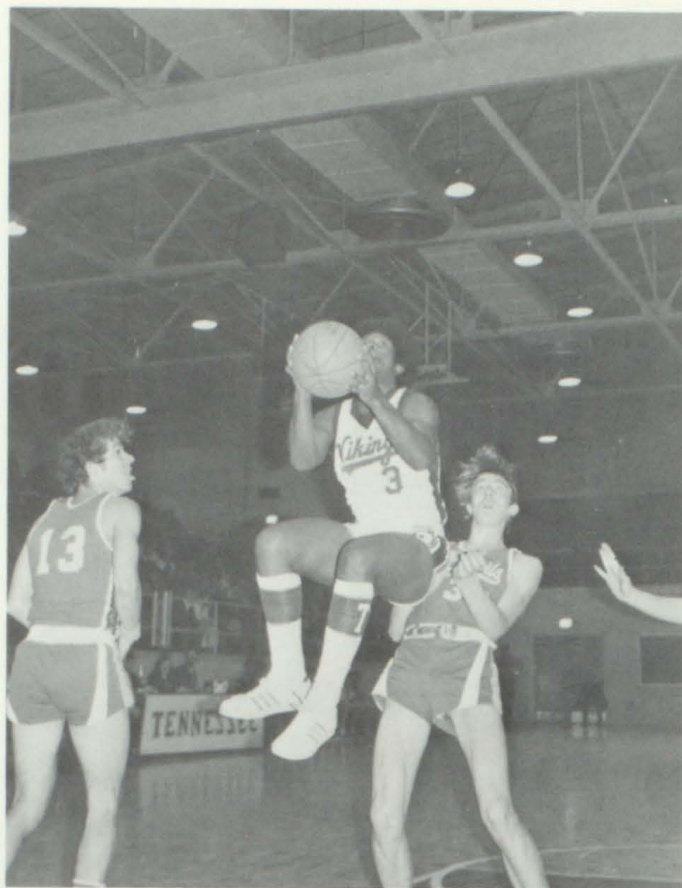

Stephen T. Boretsky, a native of Pennsylvania, came to Bristol in 1946 as a teacher and football and basketball coach of Tennessee High. In 1949 he was named principal of the junior high school, and in 1953 he became principal of T.H.S.

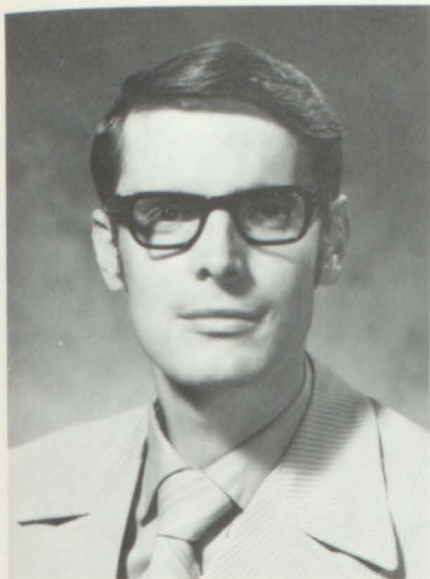

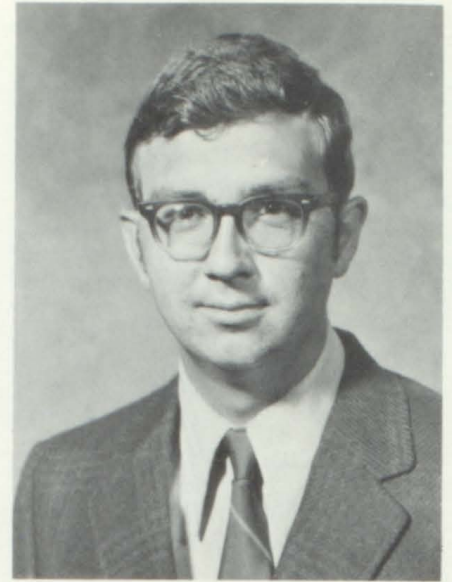

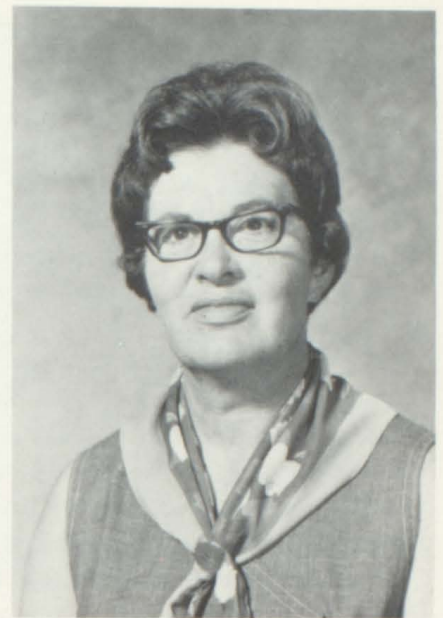

We believe the student who acquires a thorough foundation in mathematics will become an efficient citizen, because he will be able to think logically and make accurate decisions in every branch of endeavor to succeed in college courses and to enter occupations requiring the use of mathematics.

Courses offered are one year of General Mathematics, two years of Algebra, one year of Geometry, one semester of Trigonometry and one semester of Advanced Algebra.

In the Spanish classes the conscientious student is trained to understand, speak, read, and write Spanish fluently in record time under a new method recently perfected at Tennessee High School and not available elsewhere. The better students are at least fluent by the end of Spanish II, and virtually all are fluent by the end of Spanish III. Thus far the best students have been entering college Spanish at the third year level by placement test scores or demonstrated fluency and have been winners in state and national competitive contests.

One hundred twenty-five students are enrolled in the four year program offered by the Latin department. All courses stress the appropriate fundamentals of grammar that develop translation ability and facility with English vocabulary and language. Knowledge of the great Roman culture and civilization which has become our heritage is stressed.

The objective of the French program is mastery of basic skills, working toward correct and fluent use of the language. Upon completion of three years in the French program, students should be relatively competent in speaking, understanding, reading and writing creatively.

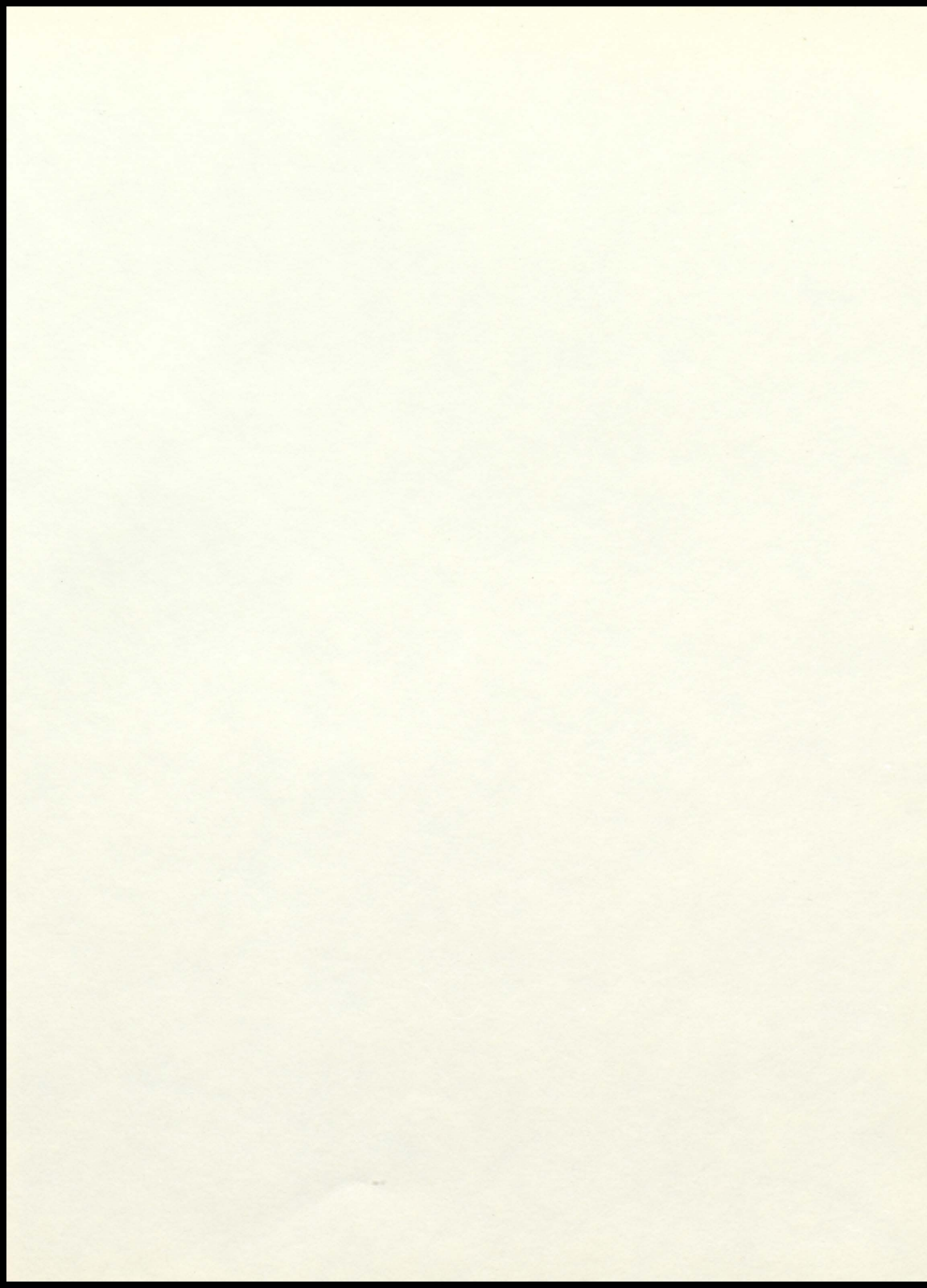


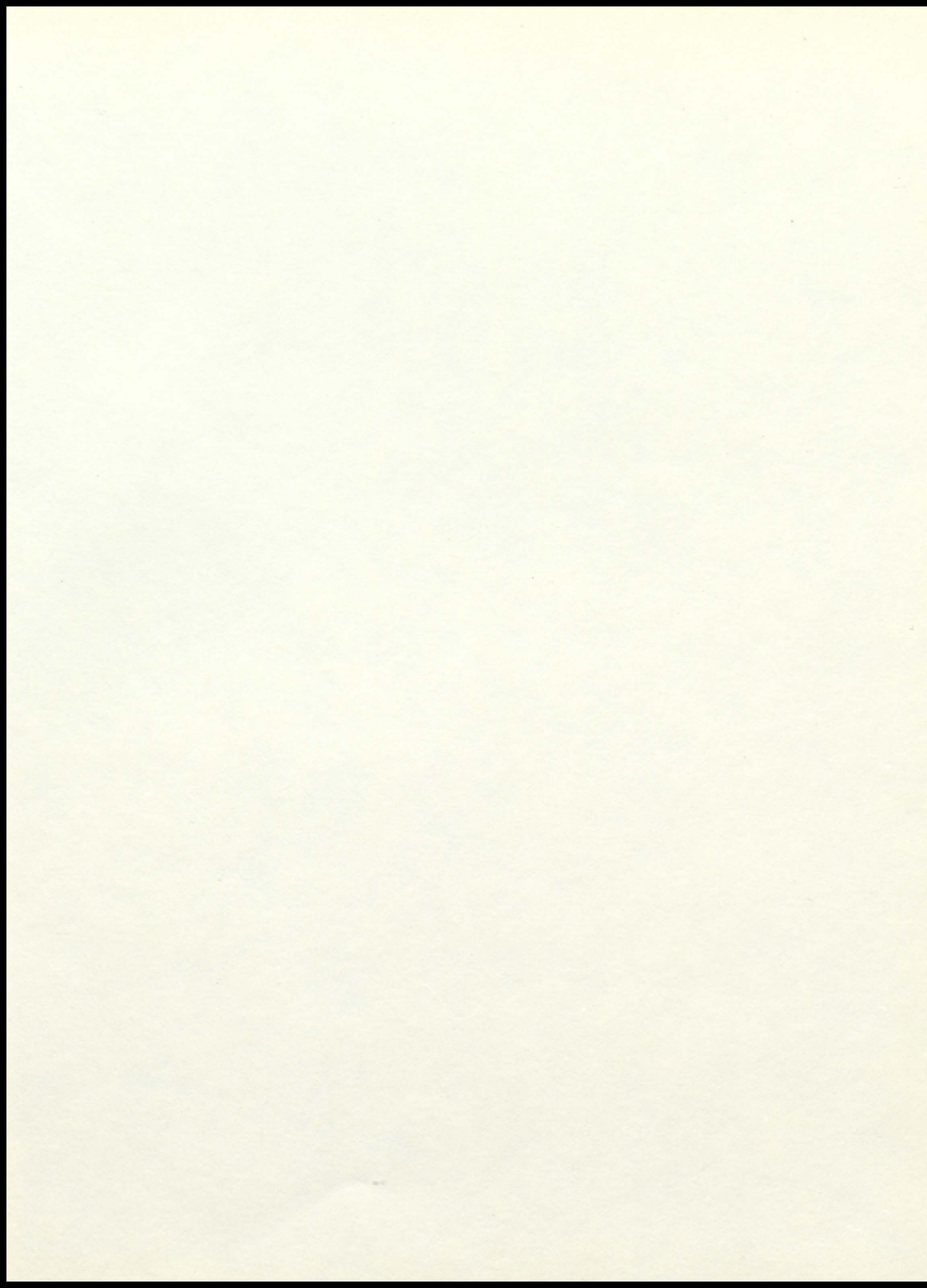
RETROSPECT

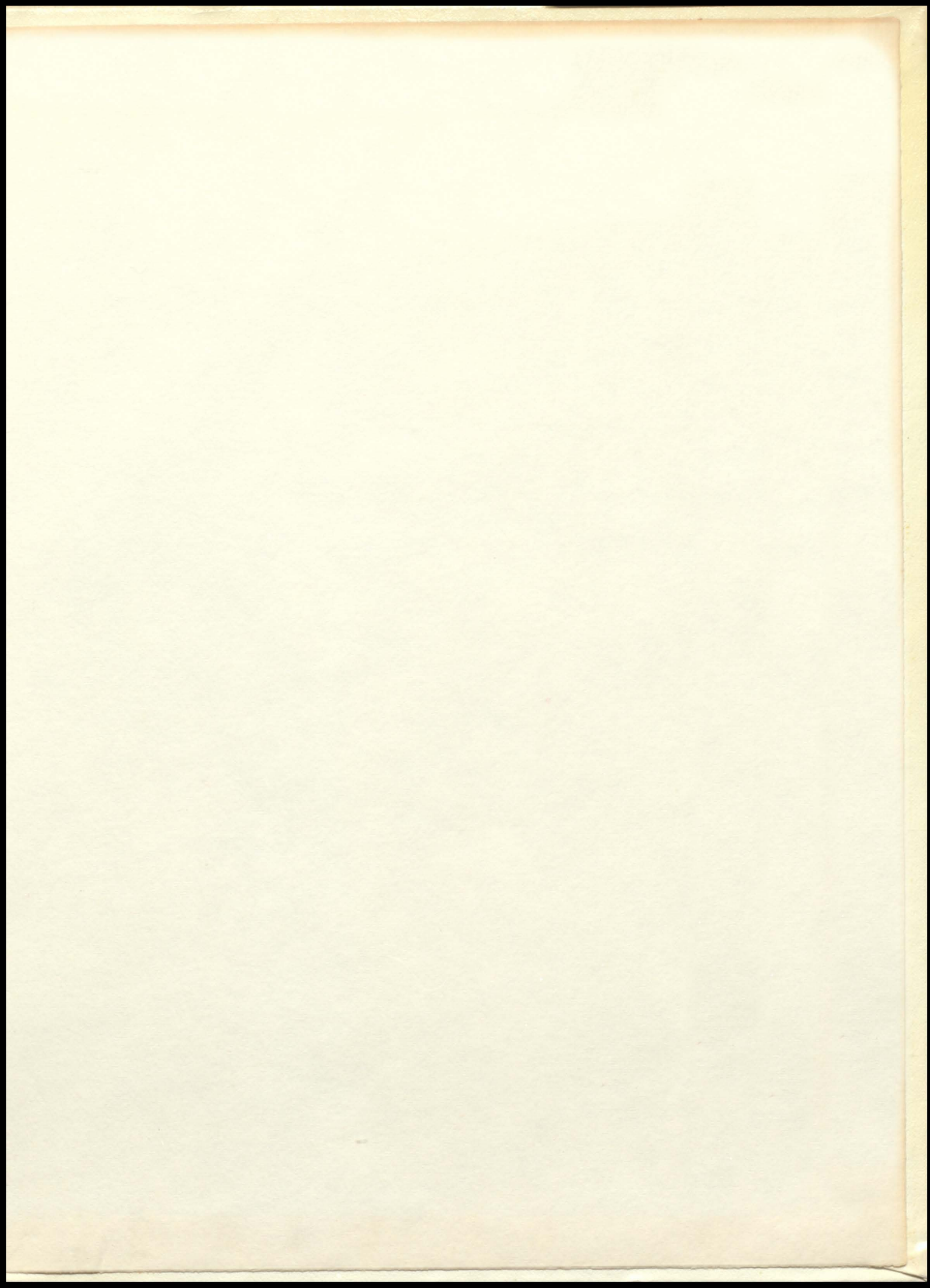
